President's Message

August is an Important Month in the History of Voting Rights in the US

Hello, friends!

The month of August is a hugely significant month in our history. This year marks the 100th Anniversary of the 19th amendment. After years of protest and women getting beaten and thrown in jail for their beliefs, the 19th Amendment was passed by Congress on June 4, 1919, and ratified on August 18, 1920, granting women the right to vote.

We had initially discussed plans for recognizing this throughout the year, but then we were engulfed in a world-wide pandemic and scrambling to keep businesses afloat. As women have done throughout history, we will get through this and emerge even stronger than before.

In recognition of this very momentous occasion, I would like to discuss a few facts about the Women's Suffrage Movement and the 19th Amendment.

- 1. On the eve of the inauguration of President Woodrow Wilson in 1913, protesters held a massive suffrage parade in the nation's capital, and hundreds of women were injured. That same year, Alice Paul founded the Congressional Union for Woman Suffrage, which later became the National Woman's Party.
- 2. Abolitionists like William Lloyd Garrison, Wendell Phillips, and Frederick Douglass supported the women's rights movement and publicized their cause.
- 3. At the Seneca Falls Convention, Elizabeth Cady Stanton proposed the very radical right to vote against the advice of others and that carried only with the help of Frederick Douglass's endorsement, who was also in attendance. As Douglass pointed out, the vote was the most fundamental right, the guarantor of all other rights.

4. Teddy Roosevelt was a big proponent of women's right to vote. In

fact, his Harvard senior thesis was about equal rights for women.

- 5. Twelve other countries granted women the right to vote before the U.S.
- 6. The southern states opposed the 19th Amendment. The Tennessee Legislature had reached a 48-48 tie and the final vote came from a 23-year-old, Harry T. Burn. Though he opposed it, his mother convinced him to do the right thing and vote for it. With his vote, the 19th Amendment was fully ratified.
- 7. Mississippi was the last state to ratify the amendment in 1984. Remember that the next time that you visit the state.
- 8. Wyoming, the first state to grant voting rights to women in 1869, was also the first state to elect a female governor.
- 9. And finally.... Over nine million women voted for the first time in the Presidential Election in November 1920. That was just the beginning of our fight for equality.

These are just a few facts about our history, and we should never forget to pay homage to those amazing women (and a few brave men) who fought for and earned our right to vote.

I like to think about what those women would think and feel if they could see how far we have come since 1920. I hope that they would be proud of what they started. We have come an exceptionally long way since then, and we still must continue to push for equality.
