President's Message

Kathy Greene's Inaugural Address

"First, I wish to thank President Phyllis Nelson and the board for an incredible year of accomplishments. Phyllis has led the board with clear direction, conviction and humor, to prepare the Network for the next 40 years. I am honored to have been selected to be the 2016-2017 SECT Women's Network President.

"So how did I arrive here? As those philosophers the Beatles have said, "It was a long and winding road!" Finding the right road, path or purpose is what it is all about. Sometimes it is clear, sometimes the path chooses you and sometimes you can choose the path.

"29 years ago, the path was clear to me and I found my passion working with children and adults with disabilities. Five years later, I took a leap of faith and started a non-profit, The Light House, to provide community based special education schools. Those who start a business, know it is a 24/7 endeavor. There is little time to network or have a life.

"Then, 13 years ago the road changed and the universe chose a path for me. A friend called to let us know she was dying of cancer and was putting me on the bottom of a list of potential guardians for her six year old daughter. Somehow I rose to the top of the list and in March of 2003, this young lady arrived in Connecticut. The universe seemed to know that this would make her life and mine better, and it has.

"We never know when our paths will change and the road takes a sudden detour. Having a network of women makes a difference. The women who were my mentors and friends, found a pediatrician, a family therapist, an afterschool program and time on their schedule to help me. My sisters found time on weekends to have their children and grandchildren available for activities.

"This is what networking is all about. I have seen this many times in the Women's Network. Someone will express a need and there is an outpouring of resources, referrals and help. I believe this stems not only from the mission of the Network but also from our founder Millie Devine, who set the standard to treat

others the way you wish to be treated.

"Five years ago, I needed help with my social and networking skills, but I had no idea where to start. I saw an ad in the paper for a speaker that I wanted to hear and guess what, it was being sponsored by an organization that had the word network in it. I entered the luncheon, not knowing anyone or where to sit. But there was Deb McGrath who made me feel welcome. I returned again and joined.

"I realized that becoming a member was important to help me get back in shape, socially. When you do not use your networking skills, they weaken like your muscles. I joined a mastermind group that Past President Leslie Hammond taught. This was also a first for me. It was a small group of women working to strengthen their voices. From there, I was asked to join the board, first as an alternate and then for a three year term. Once on the board, I had a choice of committees to join. I joined the program committee, because it was a speaker that had brought me to the Network. I have loved being on this committee. Helping to plan the monthly presentations and getting to know each of the speakers, I have learned so much. You truly discover what a wealth of knowledge and resources we have in this Network. I chose this path to join the Network and try new things, because like everything else in life you get out what you put in.

"There is so much to be involved with at the Network. You can join committees, or a mastermind group, perhaps be asked to present at a monthly luncheon, learn new information for your business, make valuable connections and friendships and get in shape socially, as I did.

"This year we will continue to work with Wild Apricot and look at all the available options it offers. Having everything online will continue to make us more accessible for a new generation of members and will add to all the benefits the Network offers. Promoting those benefits is important so that more women are aware of all the resources available for them.

Women's Leadership Forum

"Honoring Our Past, Empowering Our Future"

On Sunday, October 2, 2016 the first Women's Leadership Forum will be held at Leamy Hall at the U.S. Coast Guard Academy (USCGA). Registration begins at 9:00 a.m., and the main event runs from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The title of the forum is "Honoring Our Past, Empowering Our Future." Network member, Lisa Giordano is founder of the forum and is co-chairing the event with Commander Erica Mohr of the Coast Guard Women's Leadership Initiative.

The morning program will begin with a brunch in recognition of the 40th Anniversaries of women being accepted into the first class at the USCGA, the founding of the SECT Women's Network and the founding of Safe Futures. A presentation by Network Founder, Millie Devine as well as a Coast Guard Alumna will be followed by table discussions on women's leadership – past, present and future.

Oscar-winning producer, GERALYN White Dreyfous will be the Keynote Speaker during the afternoon program. Dreyfous has produced countless award-winning documentary films including: "Born Into Brothels," "Miss Representation," "Kick Like A Girl," "The Hunting Grounds," "The Square," "The Invisible War," and the critically acclaimed "Beauty in Truth: Alice Walker," and many more. The International Documentary Association honored Dreyfous with the Amicus Award in 2013 for her significant contribution to documentary filmmaking, and Variety recognized her in their 2014 Women's Impact Report highlighting her work in the entertainment industry.

A panel discussion on the topic "Ethical Leadership for a Sustainable Future" will follow the keynote speaker and in-

clude women trailblazers including the USCG's Vice Admiral Sandra Stosz, the first woman superintendent of a U.S. military academy, Grace Jones, past president of Three Rivers Community College, Lynn Malerba, the first woman Chief of the Mohegan Tribe and Maryam Elahi, President and CEO of the Community Foundation of Eastern CT. Additionally, a Resource Fair made up of organizations from the area that support leadership initiatives for women and girls will be held throughout the day.

High School Junior and Senior girls from the area will be invited to attend the afternoon program for free, and will have the opportunity to apply for a college scholarship sponsored by the Women's Leadership Forum. Sponsorships and donations are being accepted to support Pathway to a Safe Future, the Coast Guard Women's Leadership Initiative, the college scholarship for High School Girls, as well as scholarships for women of limited means to attend the Women's Leadership Forum.
