Network Woman of the Year 2018

Susan Dombrowski introduced Emma Palzere-Rae as the SECT Women's Network Woman of the Year at the June 20th Juncheon.

"Good afternoon, I am Susan Dombrowski, the 2017 Network Woman of the Year. As such, it was my

pleasure to lead this year's selection committee, which is made up of prior recipients of this award (no good deed goes unpunished!). At this time, would the past Women of the Years please stand and be recognized? You're all amazing, and we have all

learned so much by watching you. The committee has selected as the 2018 Woman of the Year...Emma Palzere-Rae.

"Emma is a dramatic artist; she is an actress, a creative director, and an educator. Emma is an activist; the original social justice warrior – for

women, for the arts, for history, for all of us. And Emma is a commu-

Woman of the Year...from page 1 nity builder; through effective networking she links the Eastern Connecticut business community with the non-profit sector, and brings an appreciation and understanding of how arts, music and drama can improve the well being of employees and make a positive impact to the bottom line.

"In 1989, Emma founded Be Well Productions, producing, performing, and touring several critically acclaimed onewoman plays as diverse as Emily Dickinson, Gilda Radner and a largely unknown presidential contender. In the pieces that Emma researches, writes, and performs, she portrays women in history, bringing history alive. Since 2000, she has toured her play "Aunt Hattie's House" about the life of Harriet Beecher Stowe, one of our country's foremost women writers who lived in a time when that was practically unheard of. In a recent work, she is author and actress of "The Woodhull Project" where she depicts another hugely important person, Victoria Woodhull, who pioneered being a leader by being the first woman to run for President in 1872, 50 years before women had the right to vote! Emma has appeared in regional, stock and off-Broadway theater, as well as in film, television and radio.

"Many of us know her through her current work with Ignite Thames River and previously with Safe Futures, but her community involvement and ongoing mentoring of others is much more expansive than that. Emma also uses her creativity in acting and playwriting, as well as her skills in public relations, communications, and development in community outreach. For decades, she has blended her passion for artistic creation and social justice in raising community awareness and donor funds.

"Emma currently serves as Adjunct Professor at UCONN's Department of Dramatic Arts teaching arts administration classes. She also serves as Co-Director of Mystic Seaport's Lantern Light Tours. Prior to these positions, Emma served as Director of Development and Communications for Safe Futures in New London, where she worked tirelessly to create awareness around issues of domestic violence and sexual assault, and to help solidify the organi-


